COUNCIL OF MINISTERS

RESOLUTION № 49

17 March 1980

REFERENCE: Developing military and military-economic relations with friendly developing countries

THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS ORDERS:

1. To approve the activities for developing military and military-economic cooperation with friendly countries, as per Appendices 1, 2, 3 and 4, and to oblige the respective ministries and institutions to organize their realization.
2. The State planning commission, while working out the plan for 1981-1985, to plan increase of foreign currency income from the export of special production to friendly developing countries, at amount not less

than two times compared to the actual amount in the 7th five-year period.

To fulfil this task, the necessary recourses shall be provided.

3. Military and military-economic cooperation with developing countries shall proceed without disrupting the program for development of the Bulgarian armed forces during the 8th five-year period, and the responsibilities of our country to the Warsaw Pact member-countries.
4. The control over the realization of this resolution shall be the responsibility of the First Vice-Premier and Chairman of the Party-government commission for defense industry Todor Bozhinov, Vice-Premier Andrey Lukanov and Defense Minister Army General Dobri Dzhurov.
